An Open Letter of Support to Our Colleagues at Historically Black Colleges and Universities.

We, the Worcester State University-Multicultural Programming Committee, stand in solidarity with our colleagues at Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HCBUs). We strongly condemn the recent domestic terror acts against students, staff, administrators, and faculty. These incidents; intended to inspire fear and anxiety in these learning communities; will not stop progress. HBCUs were founded to provide protection for Black scholars and students during a time of anti- Black Jim Crow racism enforced by ultra-violence. As Dr. Johnetta Betch Cole, former president of two HBCUs: Spelman and Bennett College describes, "The HBCU [was] an atmosphere where a student's humanity [was] never challenged."

The outward challenge continues.

Facing the pandemic together has shown us how inextricably connected our community needs to be at all levels. We must continue to engage in activating our agency to address systematic and structural changes that are needed not only to provide a climate for our BIPOC/ALANA students to pursue higher learning but also to have campuses continue the celebration of being BIPOC/ALANA.
