There are often **professional staff** in general education classrooms to assist students with learning differences.

There are **no additional personnel** in classrooms.

Special education contacts are always directing you and making sure you are completing assignments and managing your time properly.

**You are responsible** for your own time management, course selection, and ensuring that you are getting your work done.

You are assigned substantial

amounts of reading and writing

which may not be directly addressed

in class.

You have **the same teacher** for the entire school year.

You are expected to read short

assignments that are then discussed

and often re-taught in class.

You **change professors each** semester when you register for classes.

You have the same classes for 40 weeks during the school year typically 5 days a week.

Each semester is 15 weeks long and each class meets 1-3 days a week. You also have professor's office hours as a resource to meet with them oneon-one. As a result the course load is more compact and you have less time to complete assignments.
