- Include letters of recommendations
- Select "YES" to Question on Worcester State University Application that reads:

"Would you like to be considered for the Alternatives for Individual Development Academy? (under optional section) Space is limited. The program is offered on a first come first serve basis.

Summer Program

Participation begins with an intensive six week summer academy (June/July) in preparation for Fall enrollment. Workshops/courses covered over the summer include Urban Education, English, and Math. Students have an opportunity to gain 3-12 college credits during the summer program.
