Mission

Alternatives for Individual Development Program (A.I.D.)

The Alternatives for Individual Development Program (A.I.D.) is an educational assistance program for students who may require support services in order to succeed in college; included in this category are students who identify as first generation, economically diverse, and/or ALANA/BIPOC.

Summer Bridge Academy

Student participation may begin with an intensive six-week Summer Bridge Academy (June/July) in preparation for Fall enrollment. The Summer Bridge Academy courses and workshops are covered over the summer including International & Comparative Education, English, Math and Skills Development. Students have an opportunity to gain up to 3-12 college credits towards their graduation requirements.

Admission Requirements

To be eligible for the program you must:

- Meet minimal admissions requirements
- Provide two/three letters of recommendations
- SELECT "YES" TO THE QUESTION under Enrollment Preference ON THE WORCESTER STATE APPLICATION that reads: "Would you like to be considered for the Alternatives Individual Development Program."
