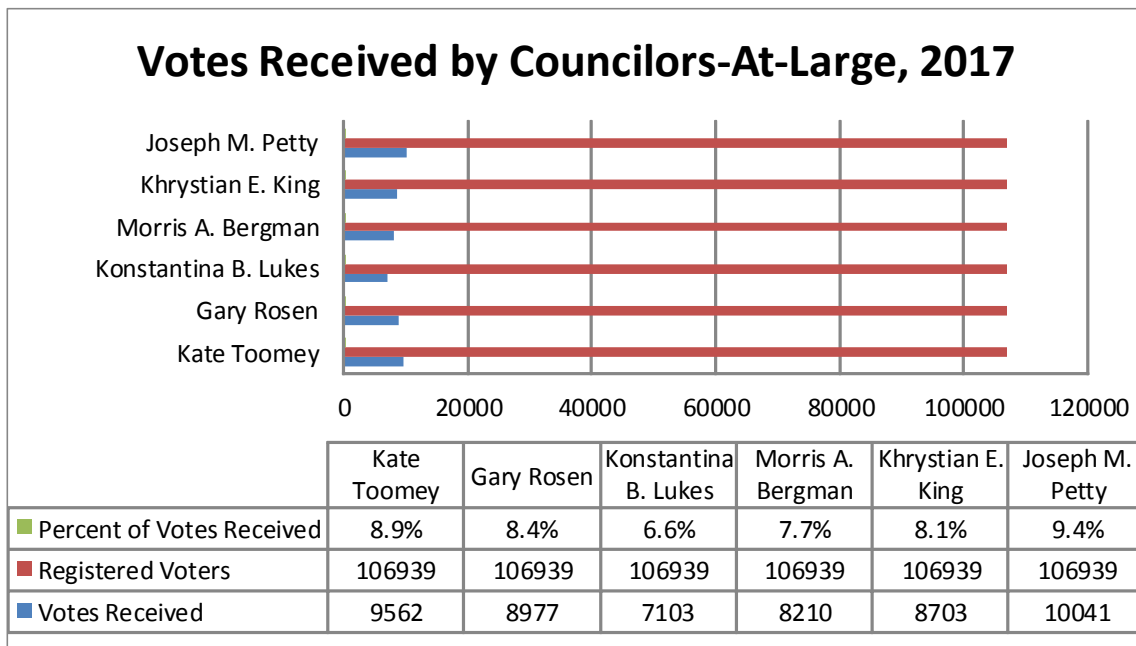
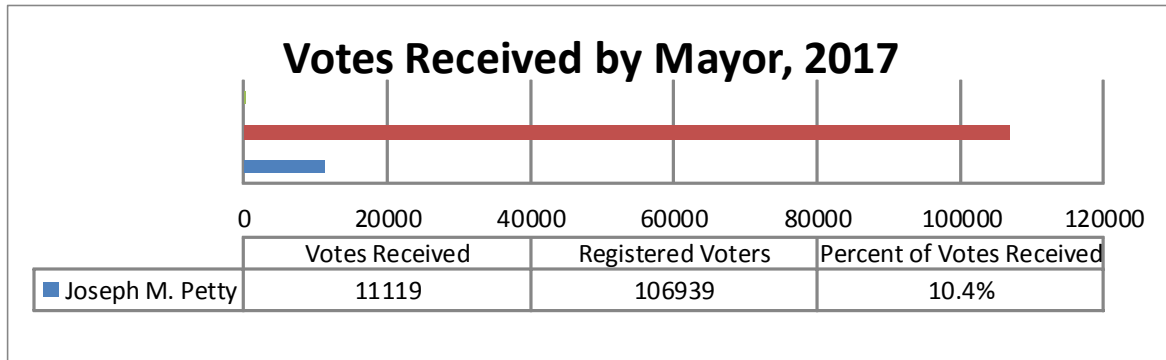
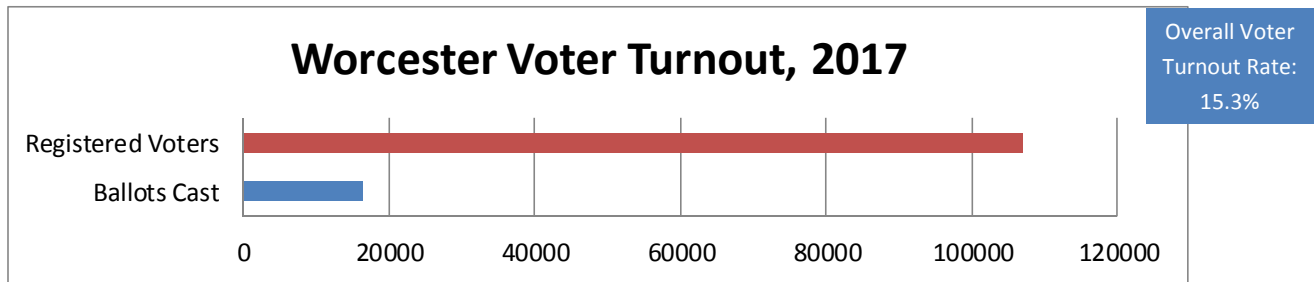
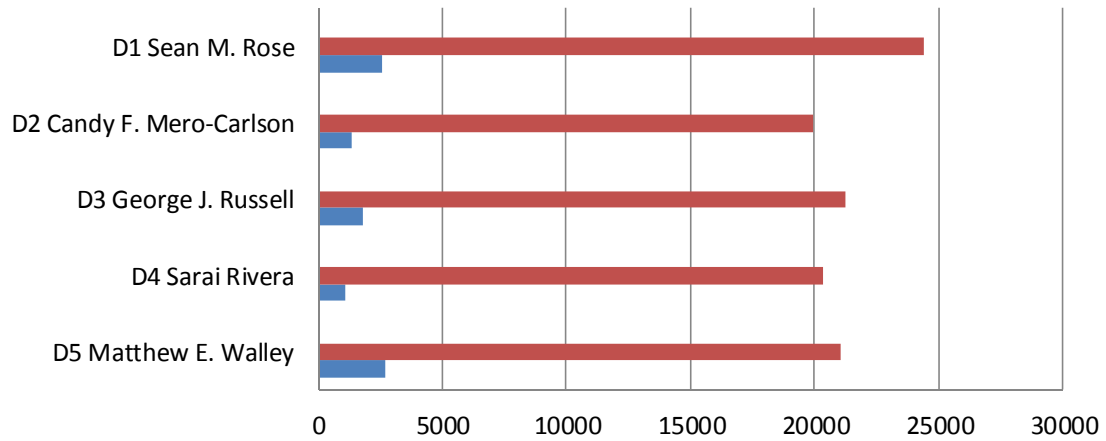


This WSU CityLab Infographic presents public data from the 2017 Worcester Municipal Election and shows the comparative votes received by winning candidates against the number of registered voters from winners' constituent areas. In all cases, turnout was so low that candidates needed to receive only a small portion (normally < 10%) of the overall registered voters' ballots to win. The mayor, 6 at-large council seats, and the 6 school committee seats are elected from the general city population; the 5 district councilors are elected by voters in their respective districts. All data is from the City of Worcester Election Results available from the Office of the City Clerk and posted on the City of Worcester website.

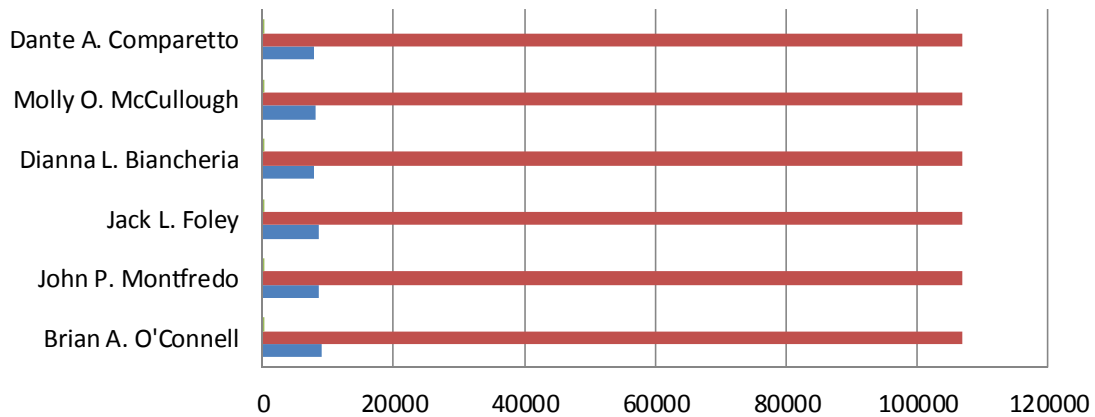
