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INTRODUCTION

On October 10, 2019, the Worcester Coalition for Education Equity hosted a legislative breakfast. US Representative James McGovern, State Senators Harriet Chandler and Michael Moore, Worcesterarea State Representatives Daniel Donahue and James O'Day were present and among those who agreed to sign a letter urging Worcester Public Schools to publicly release discipline data. CityLab scholars presented recent work on education inequity and inequality in Worcester at the data briefing portion of the day. These are the tables they prepared.



DeFacto Suspension


Over the span of less than 2 academic years, WPS has:

- had 1,443 incidents deemed necessary for Emergency Removal
- 267 of those incidents have been deemed "suspendable"
- 81.5% of those incidents are currently unconverted to "suspendable"
- between 2,352 3,528 days of "excused absences" resulting from ERs at this time over this period.
